**A RESOLUTION AMENDING RESOLUTION 2016-R10 TO AUTHORIZING THE ADMINISTRATION TO USE FUNDS RECEIVED FROM KIMBLE COMPANIES, OR OTHER CONTRACTED RECYCLING AGGREGATE PROVIDER, TO FUND GRANTS AND LIVING GREEN INITIATIVES IN THE CITY OF GREEN, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.**

WHEREAS, on March 22, 2016, Green City Council adopted Resolution 2016-R10 to use funds received from Kimble Companies, or other contracted recycling aggregate provider, to fund grants and Living Green Initiatives in the City; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the City's Contract with Kimble Companies, or other contracted recycling aggregate provider, the City receives a "Charitable Incentive" each year based upon the total amount of curbside recyclables collected via the Curbside Recycling Program; and

WHEREAS, the Contract in pertinent part, states, "A volunteer recycling committee of citizens may be organized ... to determine the charitable organization(s) to be recipients of the donations"; and

WHEREAS, the Administration desires to use a portion of the funds received from Kimble Companies, or other contracted recycling aggregate provider, for grants to not-for-profit businesses or charities and also for Living Green Initiatives; and

WHEREAS, Kimble Companies, or other contracted recycling aggregate providers, have agreed to allow use of a portion of the "Charitable Incentive" for Living Green Initiatives; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary for Green City Council to approve use of the funds by the Administration.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GREEN, COUNTY OF SUMMIT, AND STATE OF OHIO THAT:**

**SECTION ONE:**

On March 22, 2016, Green City Council adopted Resolution 2016-R10 to use funds received from Kimble Companies, or other contracted recycling aggregate providers, to fund grants and Living Green Initiatives in the City.

**SECTION TWO:**

All "Charitable Incentive" payments received from Kimble Companies, or other contracted recycling aggregate providers, shall be deposited into the Recycling Fund.

**SECTION THREE:**

Green City Council authorizes the Administration to use a minimum of fifty percent (50%) of the funds received from Kimble Companies for grants. Green City Council authorizes the Administration to use the remaining amount of the funds for Living Green Initiatives. The Administration shall develop a grant application and process to award these grant(s). The City shall also develop a process for determining the Living Green Initiatives, which will be funded by these Recycling Funds.

**SECTION FOUR:**

The City of Green finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were taken in open meetings of this Council and any deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements.

**SECTION FIVE:**

Green City Council declares this to be an emergency immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Green. Provided that this legislation receives the affirmative vote of three-fourths of the members elected or appointed to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest time allowed by law.
