Mr. Humphrey advised the administration has asked for second reading passage. The amount of the appropriation was \$429,275. The approximate cost to construct is \$390,250. the appropriation is for 10% higher to account for any contingencies that may occur during the construction. The Committee discussed that Cavanaugh was deemed to be the lowest and best bid. They were not the lowest bid but the administration, after reviewing the bidders and their history and ability to conduct this scale of a project, Cavanaugh did submit the lowest and best bid. X. Mayor's Report
