A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF GREEN TO DISPOSE OF UNNEEDED VEHICLES AND EQUIPMENT BY SALE VIA ONLINE AUCTION, PURSUANT TO SECTION 721.15 OF THE REVISED CODE, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City of Green has unneeded vehicles and equipment in the Service, Highway, and Parks Divisions that are no longer needed for municipal purposes; and

WHEREAS, Section 721.15 of the Revised Code requires that property valued in excess of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) be sold to the highest and best bidder; and

WHEREAS, the City of Green desires to dispose of the unneeded vehicles and equipment.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GREEN, COUNTY OF SUMMIT, AND STATE OF OHIO THAT:

SECTION ONE:

Green City Council directs and authorizes the Director of Public Service to identify the equipment to be auctioned by the City. A list of the equipment to be sold is attached as **AMENDED** Exhibit "A."

SECTION TWO:

Green City Council directs and authorizes the Director of Public Service to advertise the date and time of the auction once per week for at least two consecutive weeks, in accordance with Revised Code Section 721.15, and authorizes the City to participate in the online auction site, www.govdeals.com, Liquidity Servicing Operations, LLC, to dispose of the unneeded vehicles and equipment. After the auction, the Director of Public Service is authorized to dispose of any of the remaining vehicles and equipment if not sold.

SECTION THREE:

The City of Green finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were taken in open meetings of this Council and any deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements.

SECTION FOUR:

Green City Council declares this to be an emergency immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Green. Provided that this legislation receives the affirmative vote of three-fourths of the members elected or appointed to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest time allowed by law.
