Subject: Raintree Country Club Meeting Tonight - Comments/Questions/Suggestions

Dear City Council,

While once nice, the current condition of Raintree's golf course, driving range and golf cart paths are very raggedy and need much attention. I understand it may be made into a park/green space in the future. How much time, money and effort is going to go into making this a quality space again? There is so much to be done, on top of the initial price we would pay for it. What is the proposed timeline and where are the funds going to come from?

Fund distribution within Green is extremely important to me...especially when it comes to road and tree safety!

Currently, Green has put forth much effort and finances towards the soon-to-be four round-abouts. However, instead of repaving roads that need it, such as South Main Street, Nimisila Road (including the bike paths), others, The City of Green chooses to fill pot holes and move on. Allotments are almost never repaved and seem forgotten. It's very frustrating when I drive through Jackson Township nearly everyday and see them repaving, repaving, repaving. For example, I've been married and lived in Green for 17 years now, and our allotment has never been repaved, only sections replaced after a my neighbor's and I called. On the flip side, within this same time period, my in-laws living in Jackson have had their allotment repaved at least 3 times...and their's was in much better condition than ours! It took me several phone calls last year to finally grab the attention of Green about getting Mount Pleasant Rd., which I also travel daily, patch repaved. It is a well-traveled road which is often paved in large long sections (rarely ever just out holes filled) ONLY on the City of Jackson side...however, Green's side of the yellow lines is ALWAYS falling apart with gravel and potholes. I was thrilled when it was finally handled and we could actually drive in a straight line without having to swerve to avoid extremely bumpy, large sections of Mt. Pleasant.

Now, we just need to deal with the trees which are all dying and are a dangerous hazard for families driving down Mt. Pleasant! I have sent email requests over the years via the City of Green online request section about this safety concern, and was never contacted back. So, I waited and finally made several phone calls only to be told that some trees could be cut back, but several of those lying on power lines and other trees which look like they're going to fall onto the street/cars are not the city's responsibility. I find this concerning, especially because our taxes SHOULD be allocated for things like this as well.

I do not feel our citizens should have to try this hard to maintain upkeep of our community that's off the beaten path. We still all pay the same taxes. Truthfully, things like this should be on the city's radar.

Back to Raintree itself. Eventually down the line, once all the aforementioned concerns have been addressed, I would like to suggest that Green put in an outdoor pool at Raintree (if purchased) for only our community to enjoy during the summer months.
