A RESOLUTION ACCEPTING THE DONATION OF A MEMORIAL RECOGNIZING THE SERVICE AND SACRIFICE OF GREEN TOWNSHIP RESIDENTS DURING WORLD WAR II, TO BE CONSTRUCTED IN GREEN VETERANS MEMORIAL PARK. AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Green Historical Society accepted a donation of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) from the Greensburg Lions Club for the purpose of recreating a memorial honoring and recognizing the service and sacrifice of Green Township residents during World War II; and

WHEREAS, the Green Historical Society desires to recreate the World War II Memorial that once stood at Greensburg and Massillon Roads; and

WHEREAS, the Green Historical Society, desires to donate a World War II Memorial in Green Veterans Memorial Park a value of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00); and

WHEREAS, the City of Green owns Green Veterans Memorial Park; and

WHEREAS, this is a public project in cooperation with the City of Green, the Lions Club, the Historical Society, and the Boy Scout/Eagle Scouts; and

WHEREAS, the Parks and Recreation Board approves of the construction of the memorial in Green Veterans Memorial Park; and

WHEREAS, the City of Green desires to accept the donation of the memorial and the volunteer efforts of the Eagle Scout Project; and

WHEREAS, the acceptance of the donation of the memorial by the City of Green requires approval of Green City Council.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GREEN, COUNTY OF SUMMIT, AND STATE OF OHIO THAT:

SECTION ONE:

Green City Council accepts the donation for a memorial honoring and recognizing the service and sacrifice of those of Green Township residents during World War II.

SECTION TWO:

The City of Green finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were taken in open meetings of this Council and any deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements.

SECTION THREE:

Council declares this to be an emergency immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Green. Provided that this legislation receives the affirmative vote of three-fourths of the members elected or appointed to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest time allowed by law.
