A RESOLUTION APPROPRIATING TWENTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$20,000.00) FOR THE NIMISILA EMBANKMENT WALKING TRAIL PHASE II PROJECT, MAKING AN APPROPRIATION, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City, in accordance with Resolution 2017-R26, filed an application for Summit County Trail & Greenway Community Grant Funds programmed by the Ohio & Erie Canalway Coalition for the Nimisila Embankment Walking Trail Phase II Project; and

WHEREAS, the City was awarded grant funds in the amount of Five Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$5,500.00); and

WHEREAS, to move forward with the construction of the trail it is necessary to obligate the City and appropriate the necessary funds for the Project.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GREEN, COUNTY OF SUMMIT AND STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

SECTION ONE:

Pursuant to Resolution 2017-R26, the City agreed to obligate the funds required to satisfactorily complete the Nimisila Embankment Walking Trail Phase II Project, and become eligible for reimbursement under the terms of the Summit County Trail & Greenway Community Grant Funds Program, if funds were awarded. The City has been advised that grant funds, in the amount of Five Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$5,500.00), have been awarded to the City.

SECTION TWO:

The Finance Director is authorized to appropriate the total sum of Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) to the Nimisila Walking Trail account (Acct#100-1900-53632) from the unappropriated balance of the General Fund.

SECTION THREE:

The City of Green finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were taken in open meetings of this Council and any deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements.

SECTION FOUR:

Council declares this to be an emergency immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of Green and so that the Walking Trail Phase II Project can proceed immediately. Provided that this legislation receives the affirmative vote of three-fourths of the members elected or appointed to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest time allowed by law.
