Subject: Re: Recycling legislation

Ugh, I'm not giving up! I'm in the process of typing something up to submit to FERC right now. It's my understanding that FERC still needs to issue a certificate to commence construction before the bulldozers can begin. And if FERC were to actuallyh follow the rules then they need to wait until all surveys are completed which can not happen until eminent domain is settled. Technically, they should be waiting until eminent domain cases have concluded. Even Nexus admitted under oath in the Medina case that eminent domain & surveying PROCEEDS construction.

Below is my rough draft of what I'm sending to FERC today. It would be greatly appreciated for other entities to also ask FERC for a stay on the construction certificate.

Please wait to issue the certificate to commence construction for the Nexus pipeline until

- 1. FERC's rehearing process has concluded
- 2. the courts have ruled on all cases related to the Nexus pipeline including eminent domain
- 3. all surveying has been completed.

The rehearing requests should be addressed prior to the issuance of the final certificate to commence construction. Many interveners have filed for rehearing including The Coalition To Reroute Nexus which filed two requests for rehearing on Sept 22, 2017.

All Nexus issues brought before the courts should be concluded prior to issuing the final certificate to commence construction. Several court cases related to Nexus are still awaiting a ruling. Urban et al v FERC Case 5:17-cv-01005-JRA is one case. The City of Green is also using the courts to challenge Nexus' Water Permit, Court of Appeals, Docket #17-4016, 9/26/2017, City Of Green v OH EPA.

Even Nexus has admitted that before construction is permitted, eminent domain must be used to gain access to any remaining properties whose owners have refused surveying. Under oath, Nexus has said that all surveying and eminent domain should be resolved prior to the issuance of a notice to proceed with construction. On October 18, 2016, Nexus Project Manager Kathleen Redmond Miller testified in Case 16CIV0715 Court of Common Pleas, Medina OH: Nexus vs Sheri Acierto et al. In court, Ms. Miller was asked do "those surveys need to be completed, then, before you get the notice to proceed, correct?" Ms Miller replied, "absolutely". Then Ms. Miller was asked, so "you may have to go the Court to acquire the power of eminent domain, then go out to complete the survey activity." Ms. Miller then replied, "yes".

So we the people, expect FERC to follow the established procedures and hold off on allowing construction until after rehearing, eminent domain, and surveying.
