A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO APPLY FOR SUMMIT COUNTY TRAIL & GREENWAY COMMUNITY GRANT FUNDS PROGRAMMED BY THE OHIO & ERIE CANALWAY COALITION FOR NIMISILA/MAIN STREET WALKING TRAIL, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, communities in Summit County are eligible to receive grant money for trail projects identified on the Summit County Trails Plan that enhance the quality of life through the development of recreational trails and provide a means of alternative transportation for Summit County and its residents; and

WHEREAS, the Nimisila/Main Street Walking Trail is identified on the Summit County Trails Plan and provides continued connectivity within the Nimisila Reservoir Recreational area; and

WHEREAS, the Nimisila/Main Street Walking Trail serves to advance the City's goal to provide pedestrian mobility throughout the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GREEN, COUNTY OF SUMMIT AND STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

SECTION ONE:

The Mayor is hereby authorized to file an application for Summit County Trail & Greenway Grant Funds programmed by the Ohio & Erie Canalway Coalition for the Nimisila/Main Street Walking Trail and to provide all information and documentation required to become eligible for possible funding assistance.

City Council agrees to obligate the funds required to satisfactorily complete the proposed project and become eligible for reimbursement under the terms of the Summit County Trail & Greenway Community Grant program if funds are awarded.

SECTION TWO:

The City of Green finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were taken in open meetings of this Council and any deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements.

SECTION FOUR:

Council declares this to be an emergency immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of Green and so that the deadline can be met. Provided that this legislation receives the affirmative vote of three-fourths of the members elected or appointed to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take

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effect and be in force at the earliest time allowed by law.
