A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO AN EXCLUSIVE AGREEMENT WITH REPUBLIC SERVICES FOR THE COLLECTION AND REMOVAL OF RESIDENTIAL RECYCLABLES, REFUSE, AND WASTE MATERIALS IN THE CITY OF GREEN, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, on March 11, 2003, Green City Council amended Codified Ordinances Section 1060.03 by Ordinance 2003-03 to permit the City to enter into an Exclusive Agreement with a contractor for the collection and removal of residential recyclables, refuse, and waste materials in the City of Green; and

WHEREAS, use of a single, “exclusive” contractor for solid waste and recycling services will reduce wear and tear on the City’s streets; and

WHEREAS, use of a single, “exclusive” contractor for solid waste and recycling services will generate a cost savings for the overwhelming majority of the residents of Green; and

WHEREAS, use of a single, “exclusive” contractor for solid waste and recycling services will reduce the amount of noise and disturbance to residents during trash pick-up in the City of Green; and

WHEREAS, the City solicited bids from solid waste and recycling services contractors pursuant to an advertisement in the Akron Beacon Journal on January 7, 2021 and January 14, 2021; and

WHEREAS, the City has reviewed the bids, a copy of which is attached at Exhibit “A”, received from solid waste and recycling services contractors and desires to grant a permit to Republic Services for solid waste and recycling services in the City of Green; and

WHEREAS, Republic Services has a proven reputation as a qualified, responsible contractor for solid waste and recycling services; and

WHEREAS, Republic Services has also agreed to temporarily maintain the same schedule as the prior contractor to allow residents to adapt to Republic Services as the new provider.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GREEN, COUNTY OF SUMMIT AND STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

SECTION ONE:

Green City Council authorizes the Mayor to issue a permit and enter into an Exclusive Agreement with Republic Services for solid waste and recycling services for residential customers in single family homes and multiple family structures with four (4) or less units in the City of Green, consistent with the rates set forth in Exhibit “A”. City Council grants authority to the Mayor based upon the understanding that the City is not responsible for any invoicing for services provided by

Republic Services to the residents.

SECTION TWO:

Green City Council finds that Republic Services supplied the most comprehensive and responsive bid for an Exclusive Agreement with the City of Green for solid waste and recycling services and further finds that Republic Services has agreed to comply with all specifications.

SECTION THREE:

The City of Green finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were taken in open meetings of this Council and any deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements.

SECTION FOUR:

Green City Council declares this to be an emergency immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of Green. Provided that this legislation receives the affirmative vote of three-fourths of the members elected or appointed to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest time allowed by law.
