A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO APPLY FOR A GRANT, UNDER THE 2020 ENBRIDGE SAFE COMMUNITY PROGRAM, FOR THE PURCHASE OF THE MSA GALAXY® GX2 AUTOMATED TEST SYSTEM AND NEEDED ACCESSORIES, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City of Green Fire Division is eligible under the requirements of the Enbridge Safe Community program to apply for a grant to assist with a purchase of calibration and testing equipment for the department's MSA multi-gas monitors; and

WHEREAS, the current calibration process in use in the Fire Division no longer meets the manufacturer's recommendations for testing and calibration of the atmospheric / gas monitoring equipment; and

WHEREAS, the Safe Community funds are designated for local first responders to acquire equipment and training that enhances public safety.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GREEN, COUNTY OF SUMMIT AND STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

SECTION ONE:

The Mayor is hereby authorized to file an application for FY 2020 Safe Communities Grant through Enbridge for the purchase of an MSA Galaxy® GX2 automated test system and needed accessories as outline in Exhibit "A".

SECTION TWO:

The City of Green finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were taken in open meetings of this Council and any deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements.

SECTION THREE:

Green City Council declares this to be an emergency immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of Green and so that the deadline can be met. Provided that this legislation receives the affirmative vote of three-fourths of the members elected or appointed to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest time allowed by law.
