A RESOLUTION ALLOWING THE MAYOR TO APPLY FOR A FEDERAL SURFACE TRANSPORTATION BLOCK GRANT (“STBG”) FUND PROGRAMMED BY THE AKRON METROPOLITAN AREA TRANSPORTATION STUDY (“AMATS”) FOR THE ARLINGTON ROAD RECONSTRUCTION PROJECT (PROJECT), AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City of Green has identified that the Arlington Road Reconstruction Project is eligible for funding through the Federal Surface Transportation Block Grant (“STBG”) Program; and

WHEREAS, the Arlington Road corridor represents an important thoroughfare within the City of Green; and

WHEREAS, the City has identified that the Arlington Road corridor between Boettler Road and September Drive should be upgraded to four (4) lanes with improved intersections.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GREEN, COUNTY OF SUMMIT, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

SECTION ONE:

The Mayor of Green is authorized to apply for Federal Surface Transportation Block Grant (“STBG”) Funds, programmed by Akron Metropolitan Area Transportation Study (“AMATS”) for the Arlington Road Corridor Reconstruction Project.

Project Name: The Arlington Road Corridor Reconstruction

Project Description: Upgrade to four (4) lanes at Boettler Road and Southwood Drive with improved intersections

Project Termini: Boettler Road to September Drive

Estimated Cost: \$12,254,000.00 (preliminary estimate)

SECTION TWO:

The City of Green acknowledges and understands the AMATS “Funding Policy Guidelines” and confirms to the best of its knowledge that the information contained in the project application(s) will be accurate, that it intends to diligently pursue these projects, and that a local share will be required to match any federal funds.

SECTION THREE:

The City of Green finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were taken in an open meeting of this Council and any

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deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in those formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements.

SECTION FOUR:

Council declares this to be an emergency immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of Green and so that the application(s) may be submitted immediately and forthwith. Provided that this legislation receives the affirmative vote of three-fourths ($\frac{3}{4}$ ths) of the members elected or appointed to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor, otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest time allowed by law.
