**A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO APPLY FOR THE CERTIFIED LOCAL GOVERNMENT GRANT PROGRAMMED BY THE OHIO HISTORY CONNECTION'S STATE HISTORIC PRESERVATION OFFICE FOR THE REHABILITATION OF THE LEVI J HARTONG HOUSE/SOUTHGATE FARM PUBLIC RESTROOM, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.**

WHEREAS, in 2020, the City of Green and Rachel Bellis & Justin Turner (hereinafter referred to as "Southgate Farm") entered into a Lease for the Levi J Hartong Farmstead for the purpose of sustainable farming, historic preservation and community engagement at this National Register of Historic Places site; and

WHEREAS, the City and Southgate Farm desire to provide restroom facilities for Southgate Farm volunteers and program participants through the rehabilitation and American Disabilities Act ("ADA") accessibility to the restroom facilities located on the northwest corner of the farmhouse; and

WHEREAS, the City of Green is a Certified Local Government, as qualified by the State of Ohio Historic Preservation Office, and so entitled to apply for Certified Local Government matching grants for National Register of Historic Places properties.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GREEN, COUNTY OF SUMMIT AND STATE OF OHIO, THAT:**

**SECTION ONE:**

1. The Mayor is authorized to file an application for financial assistance and enter into a Grant Agreement for the following:
  - *Project Name: Levi J. Hartong/Southgate Farm Restroom*
  - *Project Description: Rehabilitation and ADA accessibility for restroom located on NW corner of the farmhouse*
  - *Estimated Cost: \$33,956.71*
2. The Mayor is authorized and directed to execute and file an application with the Ohio Historic Preservation Office and to provide all information and documentation required to become eligible for possible funding assistance.
3. The Mayor and Green City Council agree to obligate the funds required to satisfactorily complete the proposed project and become eligible for reimbursement under the terms of the Certified Local Government Grant Program.

**SECTION TWO:**

The City of Green finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were taken in open meetings of this Council and any deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements.

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SECTION THREE:

Green City Council declares this to be an emergency immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of Green and so that the deadline can be met. Provided that this legislation receives the affirmative vote of three-fourths of the members elected or appointed to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest time allowed by law.
