Mr. Dyer advised there was a public hearing two weeks ago and explained it will reduce the amount that Aqua Ohio charges Green residents for water. At the end of the five year rate period, rates will be 6.7% less than originally negotiated. It will be a total savings of about \$95 for the average user.

He talked about the requirement for signatures and he thinks that will need to be hammered out in court. Mr. Chris said he hoped to have some answers for Council by Monday.
