A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF GREEN TO DISPOSE OF UNNEEDED EQUIPMENT/PROPERTY BY SALE TO EMPLOYEES, PUBLIC AUCTION OR ON EBAY, PURSUANT TO SECTION 721.15 OF THE REVISED CODE AND RESOLUTION 2007-R22, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City of Green has accumulated various pieces of equipment and/or property that are no longer needed for municipal purposes; and

WHEREAS, Section 721.15 of the Revised Code requires that property valued in excess of One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars be sold to the highest and best bidder; and

WHEREAS, the City of Green desires to dispose of the unneeded equipment/property; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GREEN, COUNTY OF SUMMIT, AND STATE OF OHIO THAT:

SECTION ONE:

City Council directs and authorizes the Service Director to inventory all unneeded equipment and/or property to identify those items to be auctioned by the City. A list of the items to be sold is attached as **AMENDED** Exhibit "A."

SECTION TWO:

City Council directs and authorizes the Service Director to advertise the date and time of the auction once per week for at least two consecutive weeks, in accordance with Revised Code Section 721.15, and authorizes the City to conduct an auction to dispose of the unneeded equipment and/or property. After the auction, the Service Director is authorized to dispose of all items not sold.

SECTION THREE:

The City of Green finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were taken in open meetings of this Council and any deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements.

SECTION FOUR:

Council declares this to be an emergency immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Green. Provided that this legislation receives the affirmative vote of three-fourths of the members elected or appointed to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest time allowed by law.
