Dear Mayor Neugebauer,

Thank you for taking the time last week to discuss the crisis/issue communications and management services we provide. CRISIS AND ISSUES

At Hennes, we handle both crises and issues. A crisis is an unexpected and unpredictable event that requires an immediate response, exposing an organization to "explosive, unplanned visibility." Typically, there are victims. This includes things like overturned trucks or major accidents on I-77 with chemical leaks, airplane crashes, environmental disasters, widespread utility outages, active shooter incidents, and the like.

With the influence today of social media platforms such as Instagram, Facebook and Twitter, not to mention a 24/7 media environment, the City's response to a crisis event must be rapid, strategic and authentic. From a reputational perspective, how the City communicates during a crisis will likely be just as important as how the incident is managed operationally. Good planning and training will mean:

- A more coordinated, consistent and authentic communications response.
- Improved communications with internal and external key stakeholders.
- Improved communications with legacy media and social media resulting in more accurate coverage.
- Better coordination among crisis team members, less redundancy and reduced stress.
- Enhanced ability to maintain normal operations while simultaneously managing the crisis event.
- Reduced damage to the City's reputation, with the possibility it may even be enhanced.

On the other hand, issues are known or planned events, related to normal executive activity (layoffs, program cuts, litigation strategy, ouster of an executive), and in which you have more control of the outcome.

Right now, the City is managing an issue – the NEXUS Gas Transmission Pipeline, a 36-inch, 255-mile high-pressure natural gas pipeline that will run through the city of Green.

While the city has done a good job communicating progress points on the project via its website, in social media and in text message updates, there is more it can, and must, do to address the environmental concerns of its constituents.

Simple as it may sound, the best communication strategy is to be transparent and proactively, consistently communicate simple messages. Our years of experience have taught us that the most effective approach to crisis communications is to: **Tell the truth. Tell it first. Tell it all.** We do not "spin" – rather, we implore our clients to tell the truth at all junctures to ensure that they are the trusted source of information for all their stakeholders.

Hennes also served three years as Executive Director for The Temple on the Heights in Pepper Pike, Ohio, and three years doing government and public relations in the automotive industry. As assistant news director at WKYC, Howard was responsible for crafting the news department's pioneering cross-platform strategic content delivery plan, successfully launching one of the first social media sites for a Gannett-owned television station in 2007. The plan was subsequently adopted by all 22 Gannett television properties. He won both the Society of Professional Journalists' Sigma Delta Chi award and a regional Edward R. Murrow Award for his role in leading WKYC's breaking news coverage of the Chardon, Ohio, school shootings in 2012.

Fencl graduated as valedictorian from Denison University, and received his M.A. at Hiram College. He is immediate past president of the Cleveland Association of Phi Beta Kappa and served on the boards of the Press Club of Cleveland and Near West Theatre. He is an accredited member of the Public Relations Society of America.



Thomas J. Fladung, Managing Partner

Thom Fladung brings more than 33 years of daily newspaper and digital media experience to Hennes Communications, having served as a top editor at some of the nation's largest newspapers such as the Cleveland Plain Dealer and the Detroit Free Press. Most recently, Fladung served as managing editor of *The Plain Dealer* in Cleveland starting in February 2011, overseeing the day-to-day operations of the newsroom. Prior to that, he was editor of the St. Paul Pioneer Press, managing editor of the Detroit Free Press and managing editor of the Akron Beacon Journal. He has also held a variety of editing and reporting positions at those and other newspapers and has reported on business, politics, state government, crime and courts and sports.

A native of Canton, Ohio, Fladung is a graduate of the University of Dayton. He is a current board member of the Press Club of Cleveland and served on the board of the Ohio Newspaper Association. He has served on a number of other boards, including Big Brothers & Big Sisters of Columbia, S.C.; Christ Child House in Detroit; the Minnesota News Council.
