I have written to Council before on this but speaking directly to Matt's questions....please see below.

What is your experience with Kimble? With Republic?

Kimble has been amazing. The extra bins for recycling (old yellow bins and open bins) are amazing for broken down cardboard. Not being forced to have our recycling LOOSE in the Green bin keeps our bins clean and smell free. Would I like to see it collected weekly, yes but I would still choose Kimble's method of recycling over Republic's limited and OPEN items only policy. I hate hate dirty bins. I do not want to deal with the smell and having to clean my bins. Even washing out items for recycling does not get every morsel of smell. Kimble will pick up our extra bulk items without having to 'arrange' pick up. This makes my life simpler when I need something bulk collected.

Republic I have had experience with directly in Akron at my parents' home. They are picky about what you put into their trash or into their recycling. You have to have all recycling in open and loose means which makes for a dirty bin.
