A RESOLUTION CLOSING GREENSBURG FIELD #4, REQUIRING ALL NEW FIELDS TO BE INSTALLED OUTSIDE THE POTENTIAL IMPACT RADIUS OF THE NEXUS PIPELINE, REQUIRING A SEARCH FOR ADDITIONAL FIELD LOCATIONS WITHIN THE CITY OF GREEN, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the NEXUS pipeline has been approved to come through the City of Green; and

WHEREAS, according to the Federal Energy Commission's environmental impact statement, the NEXUS pipeline's potential impact radius is 1,100 feet; and

WHEREAS, the City of Green's desire is to protect residents and visitors to the community; and

WHEREAS Greensburg Field #4 is within the 1,100-foot potential impact radius; and

WHEREAS the City of Green wishes to limit exposure of this pipeline on land controlled by the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GREEN, COUNTY OF SUMMIT, AND STATE OF OHIO THAT:

#### **SECTION ONE:**

Green City Council hereby requires the City Administration to close Greensburg Field #4.

#### **SECTION TWO:**

Green City Council hereby directs the City Administration to put no additional ballfields within the potential impact radius of the NEXUS pipeline.

### **SECTION THREE:**

Green City Council hereby directs the City Administration to explore all options through redesignation or acquisition to build additional ball fields for city residents, using Pipeline Settlement Fund money's, if necessary and available, to replace and add to the City's ball field portfolio.

## **SECTION FOUR:**

The City of Green finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were taken in open meetings of this Council and any deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements.

# **SECTION FIVE:**

Green City Council declares this to be an emergency immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Green and so that municipal projects may move forward immediately. Provided that this legislation receives the affirmative vote of three-fourths of the members elected or appointed to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest time allowed by law.
