AN ORDINANCE TO IMPROVE THE EMERGENCY SERVICES IN THE SOUTHWEST QUADRANT OF THE CITY OF GREEN AND TO APPROPRIATE FROM THE PIPELINE SETTLEMENT FUND, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, improving emergency safety services and emergency response times in the southwest quadrant of the City of Green will benefit both residents in that quadrant and residents throughout the City; and

WHEREAS, many residents of the City reside in the southwest quadrant of the City of Green in proximity to the NEXUS Pipeline; and

WHEREAS, safety services are appropriate expenditures for the use of the Pipeline Settlement Fund.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GREEN, COUNTY OF SUMMIT, AND STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

SECTION ONE:

The City of Green has determined that improving safety services and emergency response times is an appropriate expenditure of the Pipeline Settlement Fund as a safety improvement expense to protect the City and its residents.

SECTION TWO:

Green City Council authorizes the Finance Director to transfer Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000.00) to the Capital Projects Reserve Fund (Fund 401) from the unappropriated balance of the Pipeline Settlement Fund (Fund 245) to study, design, and implement a plan to improve safety services and emergency response times in the southwest quadrant of the City of Green.

SECTION THREE:

The City of Green finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council and any deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements.

SECTION FOUR:

Council declares this to be an emergency immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Green. Provided that this legislation receives the affirmative vote of three-fourths (¾ths) of the members elected or appointed to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest time allowed by law.
