Mr. Yeargin opened the public hearing at 7:34 p.m. He gave a brief history of the project. He advised there is a reduction of 163 homes. It will now include 77 cluster homes and 147 townhome units for a total of 224 units. Mr. Wiethe explained the road layout will not change. They are just looking into reducing homes. Platting will come back to Council.

Chris Brown, of K Hovanian Homes at 3296 Columbia Road, Richfield - Mr. Brown briefly explained the changes to the project.

Mr. Speight asked if there was a development that (KHOV) they could go see like this development. Mr. Brown said to look online. They have not built any townhomes like they plan to build here but there are other divisions that have built them that you could see online.

Mr. Humphrey asked why they changed the density. Mr. Brown said KHOV is single family product. Mr. Wiethe said they are coming in with a different product. Taking out the apartments. The 224 units will completely build out the development. Mr. Humphrey asked if there was any land banking or if when this is fully developed will this parcel be built out. Mr. Brown said the 224 units is total build out but they have over 20% green space.

Mr. Yeargin said he remembers the people on Molly Drive being concerned about the use of their drive. Mr. Wiethe said there is no access to Molly Drive. KHOV was not involved in the previous product.

Mr. Humphrey advised he will recuse himself from the discussion because he is a resident of the neighborhood being discussed.

Mr. Dyer opened the public hearing at 7:42 p.m.

Mr. Wiethe briefly explained the legislation and the reason for it. Members of the HOA approached the City of Green regarding the replacement of the lights. Currently the HOA is paying the monthly lighting bill. They received 92% of the property owners signatures on the petition.

Jason Brant, 3324 Millwood Lane - President of the HOA. He said this has been a 2-3 year project. Mr. Dyer asked if the board voted on it or did they have a meeting when any resident could come and speak. Mr. Brant talked about how they informed the residents.

David Hewitt, 2117 E. Park Drive - He wanted to clarify that the City of Green was not asking Mayfair East to pay for this, Mayfair East is asking the City of Green to pay for this through assessments.

Ray Hanley, 2178 E. Park Drive - He is for the street lighting. His questions why these lights weren't put in correctly the first time.

Mayor Neugebauer asked how a property owner would differentiate street lighting from everything else that is in the road right of way. Mr. Wiethe explained this is not a street lighting district, it is an assessment to assist the HOA to replace the light poles and fixtures. The assessment will be for five years.

Mr. Hewitt explained they are strictly asking for the funding to pay for this because the HOA doesn't have the means to do so. They will operate as they currently do, maintaining the lights. That is how the by-laws are written. In a year and a half, they have spent \$6,500 in replacing light bulbs and fixing fixtures. He talked about their options.

Mr. Weithe explained a street lighting districts and the difference and the on going instillation.

Ray Hanley asked why they can't have the street lighting districts. Mr. Wiethe explained they would have to use Ohio Edison products and the issues with those lights. He wanted it on record that he asked why they couldn't creat a Street Lighting District.

Craig Phillips, 3458 Chadwick Drive - He asked if Ohio Edison would partner with the HOA to partner in the costs. Mr. Wiethe said they will not support a light out of there specs.

Claudia Niles, 3834 Chadwick Drive - She asked if the pole was hit would the owners be assessed again. Mr. Wiethe explained it would come out of the HOA funds or it would be an insurance claim. Mr. Dyer said nothing would change from the current situation. This is the City fronting the money to get the poles.

Mrs. Carr said the product they picked is very good and they may not have to touch a light bulb for ten years.

Mr. Dyer closed the hearing at 8:08 p.m.
