It is alleged that certain credit card companies and banks have engaged in a civil conspiracy to basically unfairly charge companies and municipality that uses their services. The referral to MCAG comes from a law firm and therefore it is a strong referral source. Mrs. Dean has looked into it and it is a legitimate company to use. There is not cost to the City to engage them, they work on a contingency fee so if we recover nothing we have lost nothing. Also, as a result of Mrs. Dean looking into this further, she was able to confirm the company will work at a reduced contingency fee. They are now down from 25% to 20%.
