A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE FIRE DIVISION TO APPLY FOR A GRANT THROUGH THE SAFETY INTERVENTION GRANT PROGRAM ADMINISTERED BY THE OHIO BUREAU OF WORKERS' COMPENSATION, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Ohio Bureau of Workers' Compensation use the Firefighter Exposure to Environmental Elements Grant ("FEEEG") Program to partner with Ohio employers to minimize fire fighters' exposure to dangerous environmental elements; and

WHEREAS, the grant funds are available to employers for projects which substantiately reduce or eliminate the risk of work place injuries and illnesses; and

WHEREAS, the FEEEG Program limits a Community to receiving Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) in grant funds in any two (2) year period; and

WHEREAS, if successful, the Fire Division will apply for the available FEEEG grant funds of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) toward the net cost of a Continental E-Series EH060 - 1210211150 gear extractor with the Fire Division cost of Three Thousand Four Hundred and Seventy-Eight Dollars (\$3,478.00).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GREEN, COUNTY OF SUMMIT AND STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

SECTION ONE:

Green City Council authorizes the City's Administration to submit a Grant Application to the Ohio Bureau of Workers' Compensation Firefighter Exposure to Environmental Elements Grant ("FEEEG") Program.

SECTION TWO:

The City of Green finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were taken in open meeting of this Council and any deliberations of this City and any of its committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements.

SECTION THREE:

Green City Council declares this to be an emergency immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Green. Provided that this legislation receives the affirmative vote of three-fourths of the members elected or appointed to Council, it

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shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest time allowed by law.
